SECONDARY WATER METER FUNDING PROGRAM

Program Guidelines:

- 1. The Utah Board of Water Resources will utilize its existing funding mechanisms to make secondary water metering a greater priority.
- 2. The board will allocate up to \$10 million in loans per year, at a discounted interest rate of 1%, to entities interested in metering secondary connections at the customer level.
- 3. The length of the loan shall be five years less than the warranty of the meters; not to exceed 30 years.
- 4. The board will require 15% cost-sharing from the funding applicant.
- 5. The loan will include funds for the meter itself, installation and equipment costs, meter-reading technology, the cost of databases and billing or reporting software. It will not include costs tied to ongoing reading of the meters, additional staffing, etc.
- 6. The loan will be allocated only for the installation of new secondary water meters, not the repair and replacement of such meters.
- 7. Only pressurized secondary systems which provide service primarily to residential, lawn and garden systems will be eligible for funding.
- 8. Loan recipients will require that all new developments within their service area install secondary water meters.
- 9. The board will require either an educational component on the billing statement and/or that the entity charge based on usage with a tiered conservation rate.
- 10. Loan recipients will report annual water usage data, gathered through the new metered secondary water systems, to the Utah Division of Water Rights.
- 11. In circumstances where secondary water metering is only a component of an overall project, only that component will qualify for the 1% interest rate.
- 12. The Utah Division of Water Resources will work with entities to promote the implementation of best practices in order to ensure the greatest water efficiency and conservation benefits.
- 13. The board will continue this program as long as there is available funding and universal metering is still unachieved.
- 14. If more loan money is made available, the board will use its discretion to decide whether to allocate more funding to this program.

Other Standard Board Guidelines

- 1. The board will require the funding applicant to prepare a Water Conservation Plan.
- 2. The board will require the adoption of an ordinance prohibiting irrigation of residential landscapes between the hours of 10 a.m. and 6 p.m.
