Please update the text with this information.	<p>The text is updated with the information on the winter status of the Lone Rock Beach.</p> <p>The second to last sentence of the Lone Rock Recreation Area text in Section 5.3.13.1.1.1 Glen Canyon National Recreation Area, Chapter 5, Exhibit E of the License Application is revised to read: Lone Rock is officially closed to launching vessels between November and April, but Lone Rock Beach and area remain open all year long. .</p>	rec
NPS Cmt 96	<p>The NPS requests the following changes, edits, and updates to the text:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) Please include updated visitor statistics information in the text; data from 2003 is over 12 years old. 2) Note: In reference to off-road vehicle use in GLCA, refer to the Off-road Vehicle Management Plan once the Record of Decision is release (pending). 3) Visitor numbers have increased at Hanging Gardens - ranger programs are now conducted there. Please updated the text to show current activities occurring at Hanging Gardens. 4) "Wahweap Recreation Area" - please change this to "Wahweap District Developed Area". 5) "Lone Rock" area: Lone Rock is not closed to visitors in winter. 	Please see the attached Extended Narrative document for the response to comment NPS No. 96.	rec

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NPS Cmt 97	<p>The NPS requests that additional analysis be conducted concerning visual impacts from the LPP project. Given further understanding of the proposed project, the Hughes quote is now incorrect.</p>	<p>As one of the objectives of the NPS GLCA/UDWRe meeting on Feb 1, 2017, UDWRe needed to clarify certain NPS comments, including NPS Comment No. 97. GLCA responded that a quote made by Hughes, a former NPS employee on GLCA, referenced in the PLP, Identified Recreation Needs, Section 5.3.13.1.2.3 Glen Canyon National Recreation Area regarding no visual impacts related to the pipeline. GLCA's response is NPS has identified there would be visual impacts related to the intake pump station, BPS-1 and new transmission lines. The text in Section 5.3.13.1.2.3, Chapter 5, Exhibit E of the License Application, states "No recreation needs relevant to the LPP Project or hydropower system have been identified during review of existing GCNRA documents or during discussions with GCNRA personnel." The reference to Hughes was removed in Exhibit E filed with the License Application. GLCA planning documents do not identify any recreation needs that would conflict with the LPP features. Visual impacts on GLCA resources from the LPP intake pump station, BPS-1 and new transmission lines are specifically analyzed and described in Section 5.3.16.2.2, Table 5-136, Visual Assessment Units 1 (Lake Powell/Glen Canyon), 2 (Wahweap), and 3 (Big Water) and text in Section 5.3.16.2.2.1, Section 5.3.16.2.2.2, and Section 5.3.16.2.2.3 (Visual Resources environmental effects analyses) covering GLCA.</p>	rec
NPS Cmt 98	<p>The NPS requests the following additions to the text:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) There will be disturbance to soundscape and viewscape likely as a result of the pump station. 2) There will be a viewscape impact at the Chains from the intake. 3) Construction could have an effect on recreation off-road vehicle users. 	<p>The License Application, which replaced the PLP, has addressed the NPS request and contains information regarding the potential effects of the pump station, intake and construction on soundscapes, viewsapes, and recreational off road vehicle users. The requested NPS text additions have been addressed in the following sections in Chapter 5, Exhibit E of the License Application: Section 5.3.18.1.3, contains a description of effects on the soundscapes. Table 5-136 in Section 5.3.16.2.2, contains a description of the visual effects on the viewsapes associated with the Water Intake Pump Station and BPS-1; Section 5.3.13.2.1.1, contains a description on the construction effects on off-road vehicle users of the Dead Dog and Ropes Recreation Area.</p> <p>Please note that the section of the text identified in NPS Comment No. 98 is part of Section 5.3.13.1.2 - Identified Recreation Needs of the FLA, which has superseded Section 5.3.13.1.2.3 referenced by NPS.</p>	rec
